

<b>Plain English explanation</b>	
<p>The Care Quality Commission (CQC) is an organisation established in English law by the Health and Social Care Act. The CQC is the regulator for English health and social care services to ensure that safe care is provided. They inspect and produce reports on all English general practices in a rolling 5 year program. The law allows CQC to access identifiable patient data as well as requiring this practice to share certain types of data with them in certain circumstances, for instance following a significant safety incident. <b>5) Recipient or categories of recipients of the shared data</b>	The data will be shared with the Care Quality Commission, its officers and staff and members of the inspection teams that visit us from time to time.
<b>6) Rights to object</b>	You have the right to object to some or all of the information being shared with NHS Digital. Contact the Data Controller or the practice.
<b>7) Right to access and correct</b>	You have the right to access the data that is being shared and have any inaccuracies corrected. There is no right to have accurate medical records deleted except when ordered by a court of Law.
<b>8) Retention period</b>	The data will be retained for active use during the processing and thereafter according to NHS Policies and the law.
